Program applications are accepted on a continual basis. However, NRCS establishes application ranking dates for evaluation, ranking and approval of eligible applications. Applications received after the ranking date will be automatically deferred to the next funding period. About Targeted Implementation Plans

In Montana, NRCS uses a "Focused Conservation" strategy to guide its **Environmental Quality** Incentives Program (EQIP) investments. Montana **Focused Conservation** begins with goals identified in local-level Long Range Plans. Based on those plans, **NRCS** develops Targeted Implementation Plans (TIPs) to guide on-the-ground implementation. General EQIP funding and funding for special projects in Montana is directed to the highest-ranking TIPs. NRCS commits funds to TIPs for the duration of the plans, usually two to three years. State-wide and national programs and initiatives still exist, and Montana landowners can participate in them as they have in the past.
